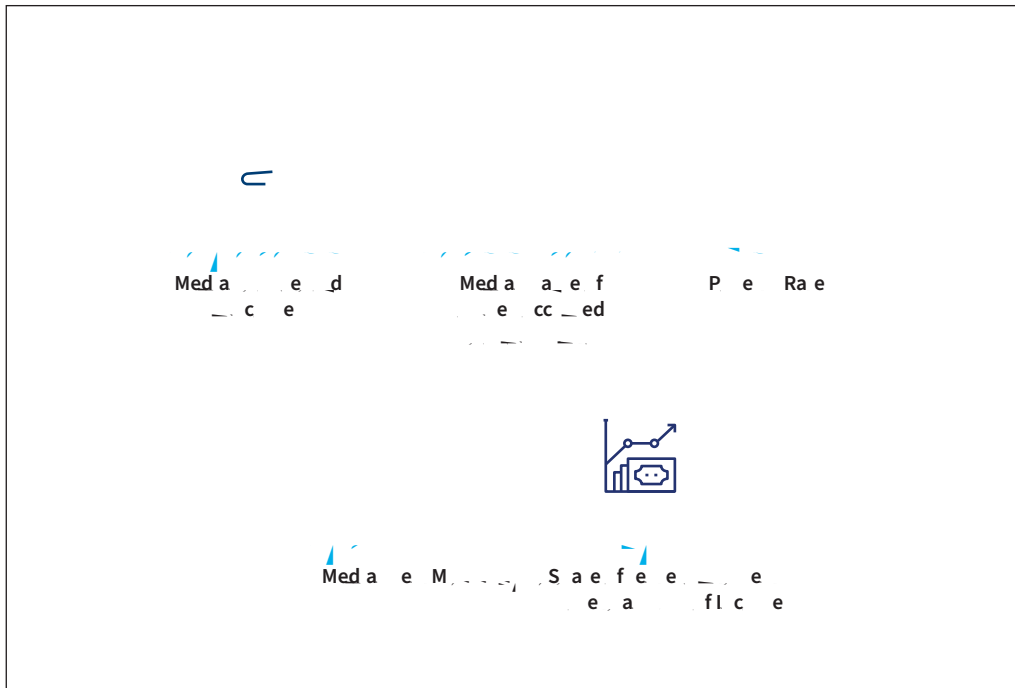


Housing Affordability Must Be Addressed Locally and Nationally

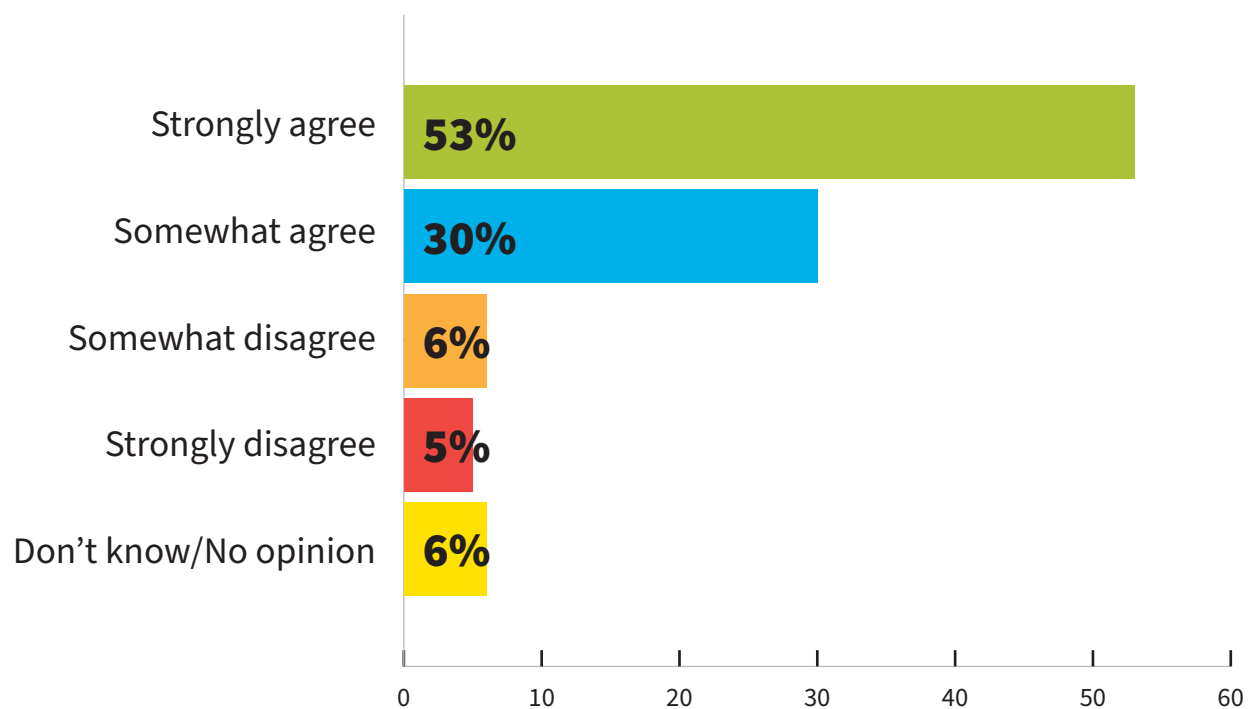

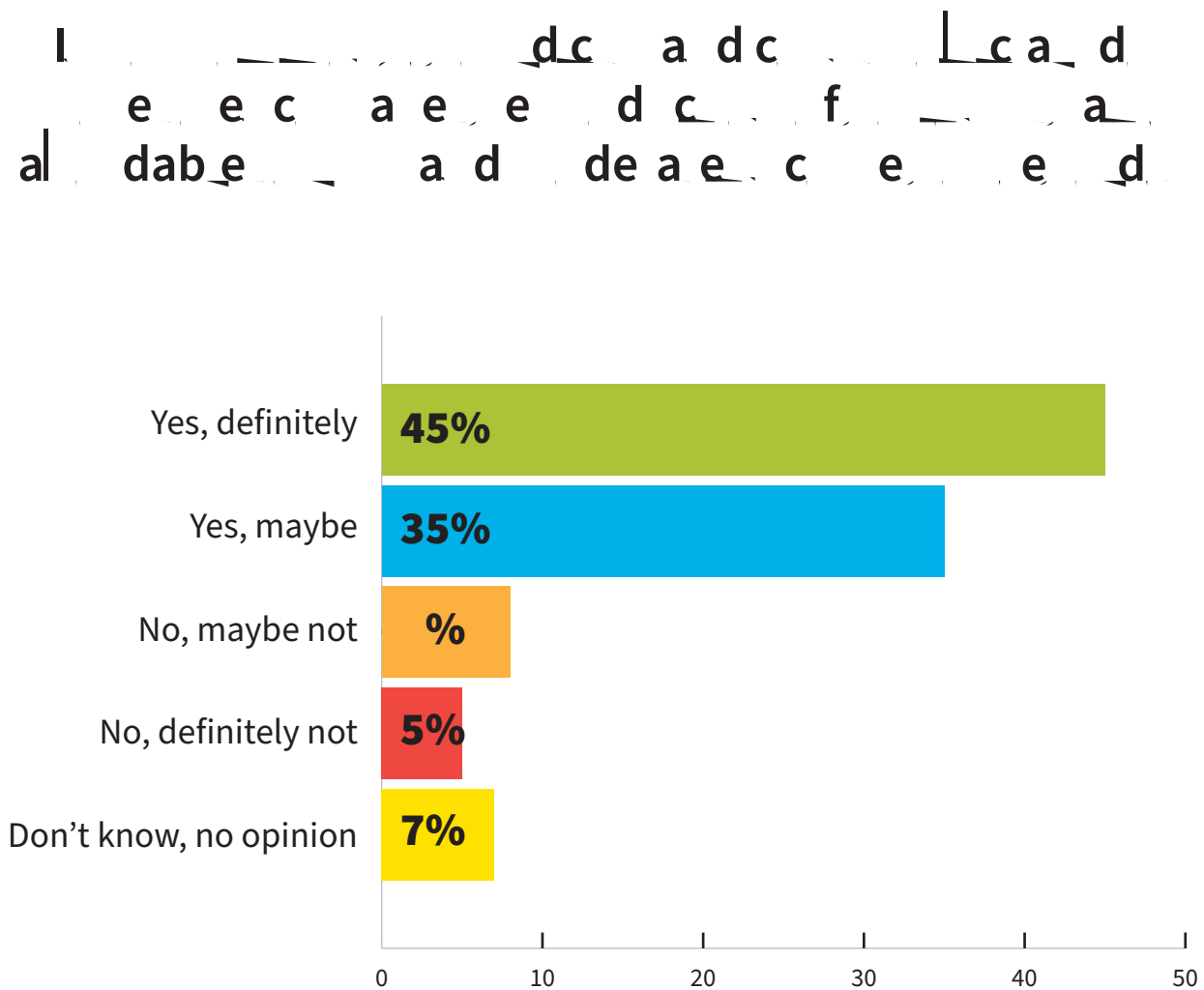

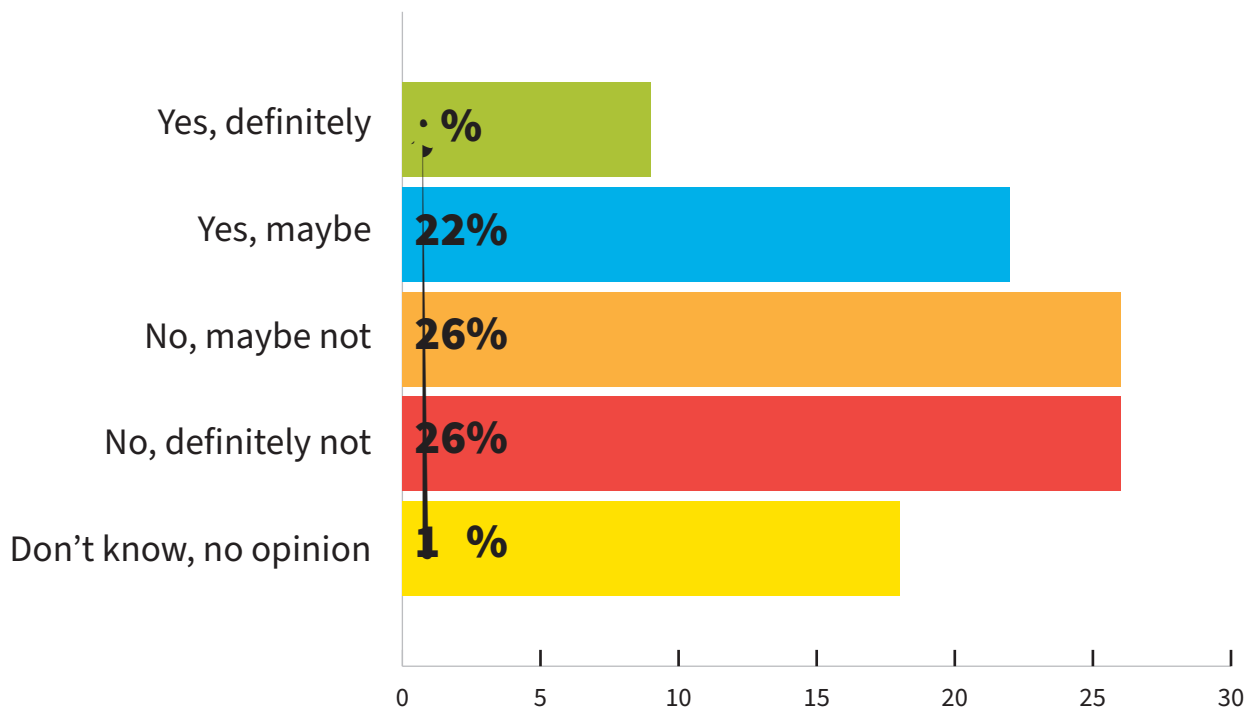
Can the federal government do more to help the construction industry?
