

Tennessee Congressional District 7

It's harder than ever for American families to find a home that meets their needs at a price they can afford. Policymakers at all levels of government are looking for ways to provide more affordable homeownership and rental options and increase the supply of affordable housing. The NAHB's 2020 Housing Affordability Index shows that the median household income in Tennessee is \$70,095, which is below the national average of \$72,634. The median value of owner-occupied housing units in Tennessee is \$327,500, which is below the national average of \$338,100. The poverty rate in Tennessee is 11.6%, which is below the national average of 12.6%. The median rent in Tennessee is \$1,350, which is below the national average of \$1,400. The share of renters with rent more than 30% of income in Tennessee is 50%, which is below the national average of 52%.
