On behalf of the National Association of Home Builders of the United **S(Nates**B), we write to alert you to the magnitude of the lumber price increases NAHB has seen in recent months and how this disturbing development could hurt the housing sector and the economy.

NAHB believes the White House can play a constructive in orbitigating this growing threat to housing and the economy by urging domestic lumber producers to ramp up production to ease growing shortages and making it a priority to work with Canada on a new softwood lumber agreement. As the nationstruggles to cope with the effects of the COVID9 pandemic, housing has been a bright spot for the U.S. economy, particularly single mily construction. However, whercombined with betterthan-expected housing demand and home building activity, along with projects being done by the D\$Vector, builders are seeiningmber shortages driving up prices by more than 60% since midNovember. The Random Lengths Framing CompeoPritice shot past the \$600 barrier for the first time ever on July 31, 2020 its way to a record high of \$955-- more than 60% higher than the previous record Oriented strandboard prices have more than tripled p 235% from a year ago. These sharp inerases are unsustainable, particularly light of a continued housing affordability crisis.
